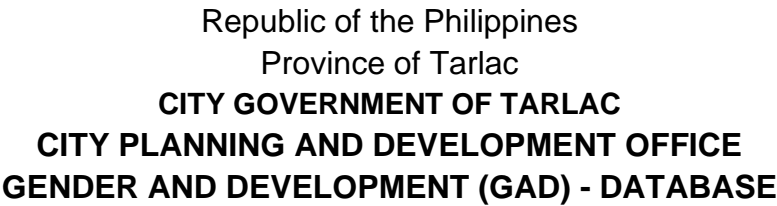

**AN ORDER RECONSTITUTING THE TARLAC CITY GENDER AND DEVELOPMENT FOCAL POINT
SYSTEM (GFPS)**

WHEREAS, Section 36 (b) of RA 9710, otherwise known as the Magna Carta for Women, mandates the creation and/or strengthening of the Gender And Development (GAD) Focal Point System or similar GAD mechanism in all departments, including their attached agencies, offices, bureaus, state universities, and colleges, government-owned and controlled corporations, local government units, and other government instrumentalities to catalyze and accelerate gender mainstreaming within the agency or local government unit;

WHEREAS, Rule VI, Section 37(c) of the Implementing Rules and Regulations of RA 9710 provides for the composition and functions of the GAD Focal Points;

WHEREAS, the Philippine Commission on Women (PCW) issued Memorandum Circular No. 2011-01 dated October 21, 2011, which provided for guidelines for the creation, strengthening, and institutionalization of the Gender and Development (GAD) Focal Point System;

WHEREAS, the translation of the Gender and Development Framework from theory into practice is through the gender mainstreaming strategy;

WHEREAS, the Gender and Development Focal Point System is among the GAD mechanism to accelerate gender mainstreaming in the local government units;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARIA CRISTINA C. ANGELES, City Mayor of Tarlac City, by the Power vested in me by law, do hereby order the reconstitution of the City Gender and Development (GAD) Focal Point System to wit:

SECTION 1. COMPOSITION OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

**AN ORDER RECONSTITUTING THE TARLAC CITY GENDER AND DEVELOPMENT FOCAL POINT
SYSTEM (GFPS)**

WHEREAS, Section 36 (b) of RA 9710, otherwise known as the Magna Carta for Women, mandates the creation and/or strengthening of the Gender And Development (GAD) Focal Point System or similar GAD mechanism in all departments, including their attached agencies, offices, bureaus, state universities, and colleges, government-owned and controlled corporations, local government units, and other government instrumentalities to catalyze and accelerate gender mainstreaming within the agency or local government unit;

WHEREAS, Rule VI, Section 37(c) of the Implementing Rules and Regulations of RA 9710 provides for the composition and functions of the GAD Focal Points;

WHEREAS, the Philippine Commission on Women (PCW) issued Memorandum Circular No. 2011-01 dated October 21, 2011, which provided for guidelines for the creation, strengthening, and institutionalization of the Gender and Development (GAD) Focal Point System;

WHEREAS, the translation of the Gender and Development Framework from theory into practice is through the gender mainstreaming strategy;

WHEREAS, the Gender and Development Focal Point System is among the GAD mechanism to accelerate gender mainstreaming in the local government units;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARIA CRISTINA C. ANGELES, City Mayor of Tarlac City, by the Power vested in me by law, do hereby order the reconstitution of the City Gender and Development (GAD) Focal Point System to wit:

SECTION 3. FUNCTIONS.

Tarlac City Gender and Development Focal Point System shall have the following duties and functions:

- a.) Spearhead in the mainstreaming of gender perspective in the LGU's policies, plans and programs. In the process, they shall ensure the assessment of the gender-responsiveness of systems, structures, policies, programs, processes, and procedures, of the LGU based on the priority needs and concerns of constituencies and employees and the formulation of recommendations including their implementation;
- b.) Assist in the formulation of new policies such as GAD Code in advancing women's status;
- c.) Set up appropriate systems and mechanisms to ensure the generation, processing, review

- and updating of sex-disaggregated data or GAD database to serve as basis in performance-based gender responsive planning;
- d.) Coordinate efforts of different departments and divisions in the LGU and advocate for the integration of GAD perspectives in all their systems and processes;
 - e.) Lead the preparation of the annual performance-based GAD Plans, Programs and Budget in response to gender issues of their constituencies and clients and in the context of the LGU's mandate, and consolidate the same following the format and procedure prescribed by the PCW, DBM, and NEDA in the Joint Circular 2012-1. The GFPS shall likewise be responsible for submitting the consolidated GAD Plans and Budgets of the LGU, and as needed, in responding to PCW's comments or requests for additional information;
 - f.) Monitor the effective implementation of GAD-related policies and the annual GAD. Plans, Programs and Budget;
 - g.) Lead the preparation and consolidation of the annual GAD Accomplishment Report and other GAD Reports that maybe required under the Magna Carta of Women;
 - h.) Strengthen the external link with other agencies or organizations working on women's rights and gender and development to harmonize and synchronize GAD efforts at various levels of governance;
 - i.) Promote and actively pursue the participation of women and gender advocates, other civil society groups and private organizations in the various stages of the development planning cycle, giving special attention to the marginalized sectors; and
 - j.) Ensure that all personnel including the finance officers (e.g. accountant, budget officer, auditors) are capacitated on GAD. In this regard, the GFPS will recommend and plan an appropriate capacity development program on gender and development for its employees as part of and implemented under its regular human resource development program.

SECTION 4. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

4.1. The GFPS Chairperson shall have the following duties and responsibilities:

- a. Issue Policies or other directives that support GAD mainstreaming in the policies, plans, programs, projects and activities, budget, systems and procedures of the LGU including the creation, strengthening, modification or reconstitution of the GFPS; and

- b. Approve the GAD Plan, Program and Budget of the LGU as duly endorsed by the Executive Committee, with the assistance of the Technical Working Group, and ensure its implementation.

4.2. The GFPS Executive Committee shall have the following duties and responsibilities:

- a. Provide direction and give policy advice to the Local Chief Executive to support and strengthen the GFPS and LGU's GAD mainstreaming activities;
- b. Direct the identification of GAD strategies, programs, activities and projects based on the results of the gender audit, gender analysis and according to the identified priorities of the agency in response to the gender issues faced by its clients and employees;
- c. Ensure the timely submission of the GAD Plan and Budget, Accomplishment Report and other GAD-related reports to the PCW and to DBM;
- d. Ensure the effective and efficient implementation of the agency GAD programs, activities and projects and the judicious utilization of the GAD budget;
- e. Build and strengthen the partnership of the agency with PCW, GAD experts, advocates, women's groups and other stakeholders in pursuit of gender mainstreaming;
- f. Recommend approval of GAD Plans and Budgets and GAD Accomplishment Reports; and
- g. Recommend awards or recognition to outstanding institutional GAD programs, activities and projects and/or GAD FPS members.

4.3. The Technical Working Group (TWG) or Secretariat shall:



- a. Facilitate the implementation of the gender mainstreaming efforts of the agency through the GAD planning and budgeting process;
- b. Formulate GAD Plans, Programs and Budget in response to the gender gaps and issues faced by their clients and constituencies, women and man employees, following the conduct of a gender audit, gender analysis, and/or review of sex disaggregated data;
- c. Assist in the capacity development of and provide technical assistance, as needed, to the heads in the departments and divisions. In this regard, the TWG shall work with the Human Resource Management Office on the development and implementation of an appropriate capacity development program on gender equality and women's empowerment for its employees, and as requested or deemed necessary, for other offices under the LGU, as the case may be;



Moreover, the TWG shall coordinate with the different departments and divisions especially on the preparation, consolidation and submission of GAD Plans and Budgets;</p><p>e. Lead and conduct of the advocacy activities and the development of IEC materials to ensure critical support of LGU officials, staff and relevant stakeholders to the activities of the GAD Focal Point System and Gad Mainstreaming activities;</p><p>f. Monitor the implementation of GAD-related programs, activities and projects in their respective offices and suggest corrective measures to improve implementation of GAD Programs Activities and Projects and GFPS activities;</p><p>g. Prepare and consolidate agency GAD accomplishment reports; and</p><p>h. Provide regular updates and recommendations to Local Chief Executive on the activities of the GFPS and the progress of agency GAD mainstreaming activities based on the feedback and reports of the various departments and divisions.</p><p>SECTION 5. REPEALING CLAUSE.</p><p>All other order, issuances, and memoranda issued inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.</p><p>SECTION 6.
